<p>To provide practical experience of Intelligence Analysis Methods &amp; Techniques, alongside an appreciation of the psychological limitations that mean that intelligence failures can still occur.</p>	<p>It covers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assumptions &amp; Bias</li> <li>• Language of Uncertainty</li> <li>• The Softer Side of Statistics</li> <li>• Language &amp; Fallacies</li> </ul> <p>These topics allow the students to discuss and explore how they are personally influenced by all or any of these concepts. At the same time, students are introduced to methods of analysis such as Pattern Analysis, Link Analysis, Process Activity Mapping, Environmental Scanning, and Analysis of competing Hypothesis etc.</p> <p>After every method is introduced, the students are given the opportunity to immediately put them into practice using an exercise scenario, working in syndicates. A valuable element of this is a debrief to the whole group, allowing each syndicate to witness how the others have approached the problem, and highlighting different findings. The course also includes external briefings which include Red Teaming and Scenario Generation.</p>
